## Fixit

### Southern NH Services

Volunteers make minor home maintenance and repairs for adults age 60+ and for persons with disabilities

*People to be helped: 22*

\$5,000

## Home Delivered Meals-on-Wheels\*

### St. Joseph Community Services

Hot noon meals to frail and homebound persons ages 60+

*People to be helped: 560 individuals receiving 67,900 meals*

\$37,377

## Homeless Prevention\*

### Gateways Community Services

Short-term grants to families with disabled persons; used for rent/mortgage payments and to prevent utility shut-offs

*People to be helped: 5 families*

\$2,427

## Homemaking/In-Home Companion Care\*

### Home Health & Hospice Care

Chore and household help for independent living

*People to be helped: 228 individuals receiving 18,906 hours of assistance*

\$21,358

## Home Modification\*

### Gateways Community Services

Installation of ramps, grab bars, etc., to enable individuals with developmental disabilities to live with their families

*People to be helped: 5 families*

\$3,883

## Prevention & Intervention of Homelessness\*

### Nashua Pastoral Care Center

Help to families and individuals with rent assistance, vouchers for utilities, prescription drugs, medical and dental care, and other unpredictable crises

*People to be helped: 734 individuals*

\$15,533

**United Way Gets Results:** 74 percent of the families assisted by the Prevention and Intervention of Homelessness Program of Nashua Pastoral Care Center were able to live in permanent housing situations and maintain current on utility payments for at least six months after receiving help.
